



COOKIES POLICY OF THE WEB

In relation to cookies while browsing

The cookie (or computer cookie) is a small information sent by a website and stored in the user's browser, so that the website can consult the user's previous activity.

viewed_cookie_policy	Necessary	The cookie is defined by the GDPR cookie consent connector and is used to show whether the user has consented to the use of cookies. It does not store any personal data.	11 months
cookieLawinfo-checkbox-non-necessary	Necessary	This cookie is defined by the GDPR cookie consent plugin. Cookies are used to give the user's consent to cookies in the "Not required" category.	1 year
cookieLawinfo-checkbox-necessary	Necessary	This cookie is defined by the GDPR cookie consent plugin. Cookies are used to give the user's consent to cookies in the "Required" category.	1 year
_wp_session	Necessary	This cookie is native to Wordpress. The cookie is used to store and identify a user's unique session ID in order to manage the user's session on the website. The cookie is a session cookie and is deleted when all browser windows are closed.	1 year
test_cookie	Necessary	Try inserting cookies.	11 months



_ga	Statistics	This cookie is installed by Google Analytics. The cookie is used to calculate visitor, session and campaign data and to track site usage for the site analytics report. Cookies store information anonymously and assign a randomly generated number to identify unique visitors.	2 years
_gat	Statistics	These cookies are installed by Google Universal Analytics to restrict the percentage of applications in order to limit the collection of data in areas of high traffic.	1 minute
_gid	Statistics	This cookie is installed by Google Analytics. The cookie is used to aggregate information about how visitors use a website and helps create an analytical report on website performance. The data collected includes the number of visitors, the source of origin from which they came and the pages visited anonymously.	1 day
IDE	Behavioural	Used by Google DoubleClick and stores information about how the user uses the website and any other advertising before visiting it. It is used to present users with advertisements that are relevant to them according to their user profile.	2 years
YSC	Behavioural	These cookies are defined by YouTube and used to track embedded video views.	Each session
GPS	Behavioural	This cookie is defined by YouTube and registers a unique identifier for user tracking	Each session

VISITOR_INFO1_LIVE	Behavioural	This cookie is defined by YouTube. It is used to track information from YouTube videos embedded in a website.	5 months
NID	Behavioural	This cookie is used for a profile based on the user's interest and display personalized ads to users.	6 months
